REPORT OF ABANDONMENT

Comes now Jerry W. Schoel, and reports unto Your Honor as follows:

That at the time of the filing of the final report of the bankrupt estate of Carpenter, Inc., the Trustee had in his possession certain books and records reflecting accounts receivable that the Trustee and his attorney had worked in an effort to make collection thereof. Most of these accounts receivable were outside of the State of Alabama, Jefferson County or the City of Birmingham, and were not readily collectible by the Trustee. After diligent effort by the Trustee and his attorney at the collection of said accounts receivable for a period of two years and the filing of the final report in the bankrupt estate, it was concluded by the Trustee that he should abandon said accounts receivable as being economically unfeasible for the Trustee to collect. The Trustee did agree with Gilbert Carpenter that he would abandon said accounts receivable to him for any collection activity that Gilbert Carpenter would desire to make, the proceeds of said collections being his and his alone.

The Trustee is of the opinion that he could not make any further collection of these accounts receivable without spending more money for the estate than would be received.

WHEREFORE, the Trustee does hereby request confirmation of said Report of Abandonment.
