

HOOKER and EUNICE HOOKER, who, being known to me, and being by me first duly sworn, depose and say, that they are three of the joint owners of the following described real estate situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

Further deposing, affiants say that this property originally belonged to W. A. Hooker, who died intestateon August 14, 1925, leaving surviving him as his next of kin and sole surviving heirs at law, his widow, Emma S. Hooker and the following children: Sallie Smith Hocker, who was designated in the Letters of Administration of W. A. Hooker, as Sallie 🚊 Hooker; (W. F. Hooker; To Eldice H. Pendleton; Nina H. Wells, Emma H. Hicks, Ester H. Calder and W. E. Hooker.

Further deposing, affiants say that the said W. F. Hooker died intestate leaving surviving him, his widow, Lessie Hooker, but no children or descendents of deceased children. Further deposing, affiants say that the said Emma S. Höcker died in 1949.

Further deposing, affiants say that the said W. E. Hooker, siest prior to his death, conveyed his interest in the above described land to Eunice Hooker, one of the affiants by deed recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Book 203, page 306.

Further deposing, affiants say that the only persons who own any interest in the above described land at the present time, are: Nina H. Wells, a widow, Eldice H. Pendleton, a widow, Lessie Hooker widow of W. F. Hooker; Sallie S. Hocker, an unmarried woman, Emma H. Hicks and whose husband is H. C. Hicks: Ester H. Calder, a widow; and Eunice Hooker.

Further deposing, affiant say that they have never heard the title of the above named questioned by any person.
