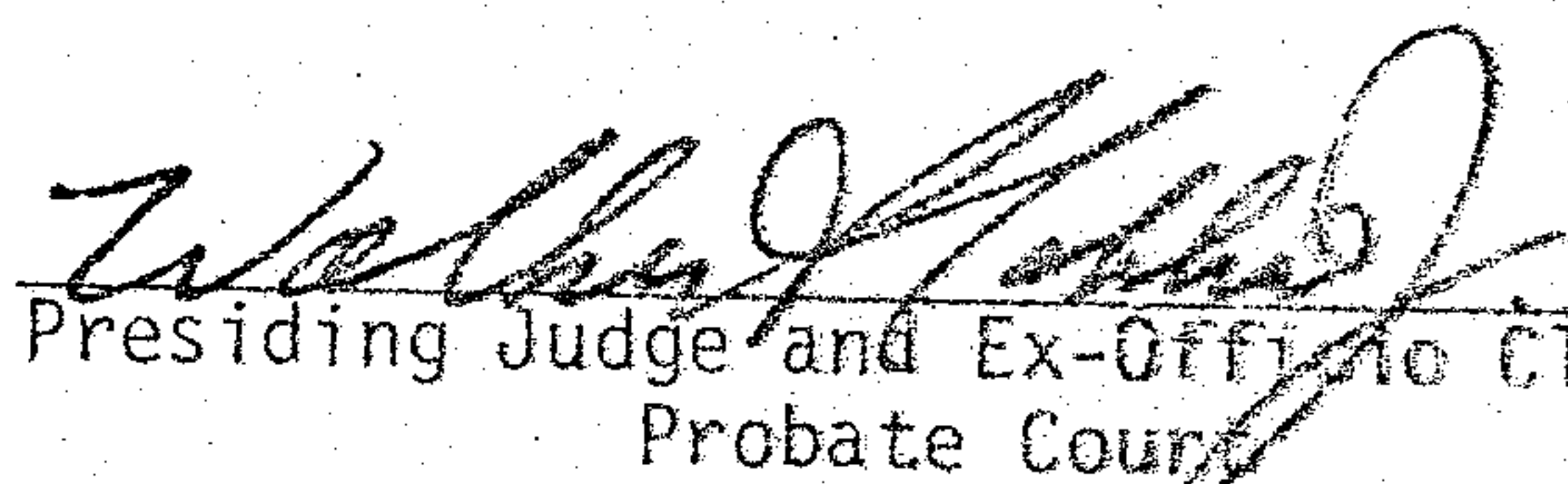

Last Will and Testament

#13600

I, Frances P. Armstrong, residing in Montgomery, Montgomery County, Alabama, do hereby make and publish this will,

(1) I hereby revoke all other wills.

(2) I direct that my debts and my funeral expenses be paid as soon after my death as may be reasonably convenient, and I hereby authorize and empower my executors, in case of any claim made against my estate, to settle and discharge the same in their absolute discretion.

(3) I hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my sister, Helen McKinney the sum of Five Thousand Dollars to be hers absolutely and forever. I hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my sisters, Nancy Kline, Elizabeth Martin, and Onal Hicks the sum of Three Thousand Dollars each to be theirs absolutely and forever.

(4) I hereby give, devise and bequeath the remainder of my property as follows:

(a) One-half shall be divided into as many equal shares as my son, Whit Armstrong, has children, to be theirs absolutely and forever, in equal shares, per stripes.

(b) One-half shall be divided into as many equal shares as my daughter, Mary Elizabeth Armstrong Weatherford, has children, to be theirs absolutely and forever, in equal shares, per stripes.

(5) The Co-Executors and Guardians for their respective children under this will shall be my son, Whit Armstrong, and my son-in-law, James H. Weatherford, Jr.. None of these persons shall be required to give bond or other security or file an inventory of my estate in any court for the performance of his duties as Executor or Guardian. None of these persons shall be disqualified to act by reason of his individual interest, direct or indirect, in any matter or transaction involving the estate.

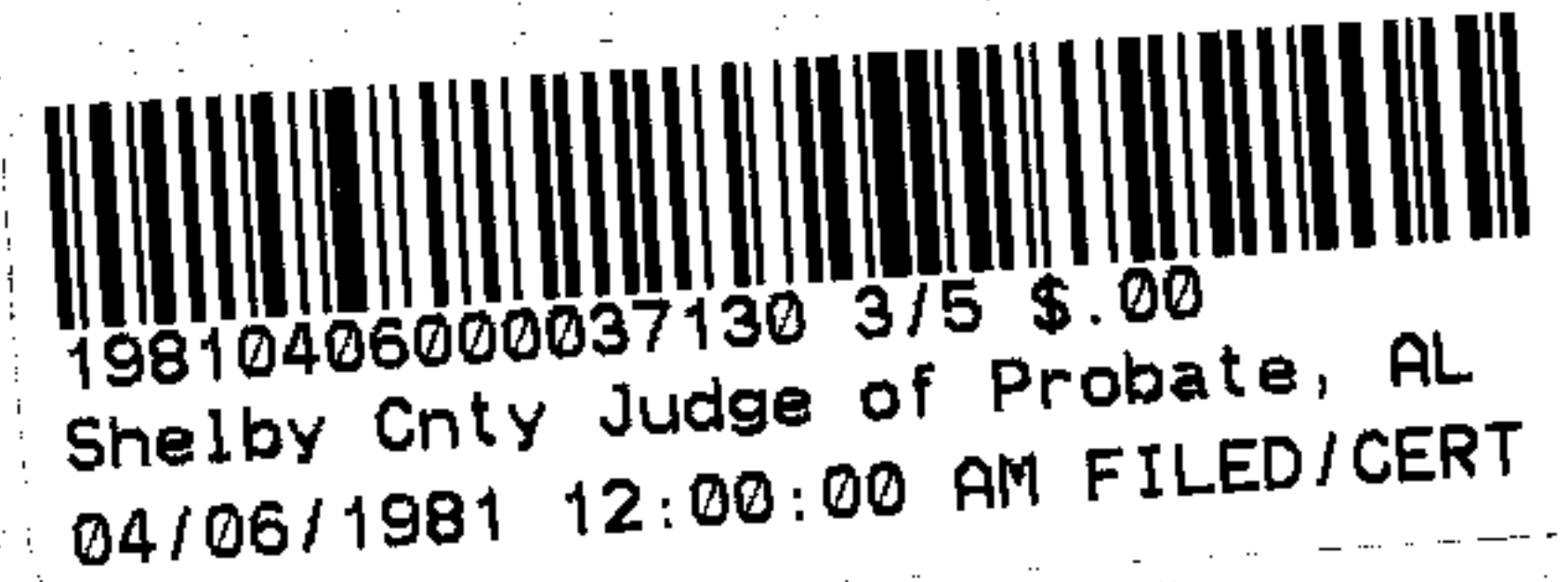
