My name is William T. Roberts, Jr., and my residence address is 2704 Euclid Road, Huntsville, Alabama 35810.

My father, William T. Roberts, Sr., who was also known as W. T. Roberts, obtained title to the following described property situated in Shelby County, Alabama, in the year 1926:

My said father died intestate while a resident of Shelby County, Alabama in the year 1934, and my mother, who was the widow of said William T. Roberts, Sr. died in the year 1945.

My said father and mother had only seven children born of their marriage, namely, myself, William T. Roberts, Jr., Magdalene Roberts Payne, C. Harry Roberts, Jane Roberts Smith, Mattie Roberts Brady, Ethel Sue Roberts Chadborne, and Ida Ruth Roberts Brady.

Mary Roberts Chadbourne was a daughter of my said father, William T. Roberts, Sr., by a former marriage.

Said Jane Roberts Smith died intestate about 1948 or 1949, she being survived by only one child, a daughter, Carolyn Smith Johnson, said Jane Roberts Smith not having any other children or descendants of deceased children.

My said father, William T. Roberts, Sr., was not survived by any children or descendants of deceased children other than the above designated Mary Roberts Chadbourne, and the above named seven children which he had by my mother, Ara Morgan Roberts.

My wife and I subsequently obtained title to the above described property through conveyances from my said brothers and sisters which are recorded in Deed Book 124 at page 333 and Deed Book 213, page 496, Office of Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama. My wife, Sarah B. Roberts, and I, have been in the open, actual, hostile, notorious, exclusive, continuous, adverse, and peaceable possession of the above described property for more than the past 20 years.
