To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, Christopher Steele, of the City of Lancaster, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a copybook of the Register of the Land Office at Lancaster, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Christopher Steele, according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the amount being in excess of the amount that Steele had retained in his possession, for the purpose of his acting as Surveyor General of Range one Section in the District of Lancaster, which is described in the Surveyor General's Return dated 2d December, 1820, as follows: "Range One Section, Lancaster, New Hampshire, containing three hundred acres and one-half acre, surveyed and platted by the said Christopher Steele,

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Christopher Steele, and to his heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature whatever belonging, unto the said Christopher Steele, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Christopher Jackson,  
PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused that Letter to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be affixed.
