To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Abraham Houston of Shelby County has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Muskogee Alabama whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Abraham Houston according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1830, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Land," for the East half of the South West quarter of Section Eleven in Township twenty two of Range three West in the District of Muskogee and State of Alabama containing seventy nine acres and eight eighth hundredths of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Abraham Houston

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Abraham Houston and to his heirs the said tract above described. To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Abraham Houston and to his heirs and assigns forever.
