FIRST: I hereby direct my Executor, hereinafter named, to pay all of my debts, including the expenses of my last illness and funeral, as soon as practicable after my death.

SECOND: I give and devise all of my real property, of whatever kind, character and interest I may have and wherever situated, to my son, HENRY CLAYTON WOOLLEY, JR., to be his absolutely, to have and to hold in fee simple forever.

THIRD: If my son, HENRY CLAYTON WOOLLEY, JR., does not survive me, then I give and devise all of my real property, of whatever kind, character and interest I may have and wherever situated, in equal shares to my grandchildren, BARRY CLAYTON WOOLLEY and LISA KAY WOOLLEY, the lineal descendants then living of any of the above named grandchildren who shall have predeceased me to take, per stirpes, the share to which the parent would have been entitled if living, absolutely, to have and to hold in fee simple forever.

FOURTH: I give and bequeath the sum of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000.00) to my granddaughter, LISA KAY WOOLLEY, to be hers absolutely.

FIFTH: I give and bequeath my cape, my fur stole, and my organ owned at the time of my death to my great-granddaughter, JENNIFER WOOLLEY, to be hers absolutely.

FOURTEENTH: I hereby vest in my Executor and any successor thereto full power to sell, convey, exchange, lease for a period beyond the termination of the administration of my estate or for a lesser period, to improve, borrow on the security of, encumber or otherwise dispose of my estate in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as he may approve and to invest and reinvest my estate in bonds, stocks or other securities, mortgages, common trust funds or other property as he may consider suitable, and to change and to make new investments from time to time as to him may seem necessary or desirable, without regard to statutory or constitutional limitation applicable to the investment of trust funds.
