 hundred and eighty six between Thomas R.  
 Brazg of this County of Shelby a state aforesaid  
 and Samuel Suttle of the County & State aforesaid  
 said of the other part witnesseth that the said  
 Thomas R. Brazg for and in consideration of  
 the sum of three hundred dollars to me in  
 hand paid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowl-  
 edge both bargained & sold and by these pres-  
 ents doth bargain & sell, covenants and deliver-  
 unto the said Samuel Suttle a certain tract  
 or parcel of land containing twenty nine  
 acres and seventy three hundredths of an acre  
 he the same more or less, lying and being in  
 this district of Tuscaloosa & State of Alabama,  
 and bounded as follows, being the west half  
 of the N E 1/4 of section 12. 14 in township no.  
 21. of Range no. 1 East, to have and to hold the  
 lands hereby conveyed with all the appurtenances  
 in any way belonging to the same to forever  
 warrant and defend the rights of the said land  
 to the said Samuel Suttle his heirs & assigns  
 forever, and to be free from me my heirs  
 or assigns and free from the claim or claims  
 of all and every person or persons, claiming  
 from, by, through, under or over and free from  
 the claims of the United States and claim  
 or claims of all and every person or persons  
 whatever, either in law or equity.
