United States of America Beating,

To all to whom these presents shall come,

Whereas Thomas Lindley of Shelby County, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa in Alabama whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas Lindley according to the provisions of the acts of Congress of the 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1820 entitled an act making further provision for the sale of the public lands for the North West quarter of Section seven in Township twenty two of Range two west in the district of Tuscaloosa, and State of Alabama containing one hundred & sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of said land returned to the General Land Office by the surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said James Lindley, Now know ye, that the United States of America in consideration of the premiums and in conformity of the several acts of Congress in such cases made and provided have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Thos. Lindley and his heirs the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same together with all and the rights, privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatever nature thereto belonging unto the said Thomas Lindley and to his heirs & assigns forever, In testimony whereof I James Monroe, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed, Given under my hand at the city of Washington the tenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four and of the Independence of the United States the forty eighth.
