 assigns, all that tract or parcel of land lying and  
 being in the town of Montevallo containing one &  
 three fourths acre, known or described by lot No. 46.  
 as appears from the plan of said town of Montevallo  
 together with all and singular the dwelling house  
 and out houses and dam yard whereto belonging  
 or in anywise appertaining to have and to hold  
 the above described premises to him and his heirs for-  
 ever which I warrant and bind myself my heirs  
 executors administrators and assigns to warrant  
 and forever defend to the said John Dougherty his  
 heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever  
 against myself my heirs, executors, administrators  
 and assigns forever or any person lawfully claim-  
 ing or to claim the same. In witness whereof I  
 have set my hand and affixed my seal this  
 twenty sixth day of October in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty  
 six signed sealed delivered in
