This Indenture made this 27<sup>th</sup> day of September  
in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight  
hundred and twenty five between John  
Brashier of the first part, and John Louth  
of the second part, both of Shelby County and  
State of Alabama. Witnesseth that the said  
party of the first part, for and in consideration  
of the sum of two hundred dollars to him  
in hand paid by the said party of the second  
part, the receipt whereof is fully acknowledg'd  
both bargained and sold and by these  
present doth bargain and sell unto the said  
party of the second part, to his heirs  
& assigns forever all the East half of the Somet  
East quarter of section twenty eight in the  
Twenty of Range one East in the District of  
Tuscaloosa and State of Alabama containing  
seventy nine acres, and sixty four hundredths  
of an acre, according to the official plat of the  
same by the Surveyor of said land  
together with all and singular the build-  
ings, & appurtenances thereunto belonging  
or in any wise appertaining to the same in no  
manner, whatsoever or manner whatsoever,  
rights and profits thereof and also all the  
estate, right, title, interest to claim or de-  
mand whatever of unto the said party of  
the first part, either in law or in equity  
from & to the above bargained premises and  
every part, and parcel thereof to have and  
to hold to the said party of the second part  
his heirs and assigns to the sole use and  
only proper use and benefit and behoof of  
the said party of the second part his heirs  
and assigns forever.

 Abraham Smith has been duly elected Treasurer  
 of the County of Shelby and if the said Abraham  
 Smith shall fail from perform all and singular as  
 the duties that now are or hereafter may be  
 required of him as Treasurer aforesaid then  
 the above obligation to be void else to remain  
 in full force and virtue
