 To No. 69. To all to whom these presents shall come  
 Henry Robison Whereas Henry Robison of Shelby County has  
 deposited in the general land office of the United  
 States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office  
 at Tuscaloosa in Alabama, whereby it appears that  
 full payment has been made, by the said Henry  
 W. Robison according to the provisions of the Act of  
 Congress, of the 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1820, entitled an  
 Act making further provisions for the sale of the  
 public lands for the West half of the South East  
 quarter, of Section five, of Township twenty six of  
 Range one East in the district of Tuscaloosa and  
 State of Alabama, containing eighty acres, and  
 fifty five hundredths of an acre, according to

the official plat of the survey of said land returned  
to the General Land office by the Surveyor Gen-  
eral which said tract has been purchased by  
the said Robins. Now know ye that the United  
States of America in consideration of dimensions  
and in conformity with the several Acts of Con-  
gress in such cases made & provided and provided  
have given and granted and by these presents  
do give & grant unto the said Henry Robins  
the said tract above described, to have and to hold  
the same, together with all the rights, privileges  
minimities and appurtenances of whatsoever  
nature therunto belonging unto the said Henry  
Robins and his heirs & assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I James Monroe, Pres-  
ident of the United States of America have  
caused these letters to be made patent  
and the seal of the General Land office to be  
hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Wash-  
ington first day of May in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty  
three and of the Independence of the United  
States the forty seventh.
