Know all men by these presents that I James
Morr of the Creek Nation for and in con-
sideration of the sum of eight hundred Dollars
to me in hand paid by James Mitchell of the
State of Alabama, and Grant Conroy County
at and before the reading and delivery of these
presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-
ledged have bargained, sold, granted and confirmed
to the said James Mitchell a certain negro
woman named Bino, and two of her chil-
dren, a boy named Joseph and the other a
girl named Betty, to have and to hold the
said female negro woman and her two
children here included with her further
incarn through life after the death of the
said James Morr, to the only proper use and
behooof of the said James Mitchell his
executors & administrators and assigns forever.
and the said James Morr for myself my
executors, administrators the said female
negro slave and her two children with her
further incarn to the said James Mitchell
his executors & administrators and assigns
against me, the said James Morr, my
executors, administrators and assigns and
against all and every other person or per-
sons, whatsoever, I shall and will warrant
and defend by these presents.

In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand
and affix my seal this the 23^d day of January
February in the year of our Lord 1820.

The State of Alabama } Before me J. N. Kidd
Shelby County, } a Justice of the Peace for
said County, & Shelly personally appeared
William Patterson and after being sworn
said that he had put in his possession of
James Mitchell and James Morr a certain
bill of sale, that the said James Morr gave
to James Mitchell for a certain female
negro woman and her two children which
he the said Morr sold to Mitchell and
in crossing of Coosa River in the year 1821,
in the Spring season he met with the
misfortune to lose his pocket and also

his bill of sale, and that he was a subscribing witness to said bill of sale, and that this bill of sale which has been drawn since is a true copy of the original to the best of my recollection and on this 10th day of May 1820.
