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This Indenture made the third day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between Littleberry Clark of the first part and Amos Murrell of the second part both of the County of Shelby - State of Alabama Witness, that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars and fifty dollars to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said party of the second part and to his heirs & assigns forever, all that tract of land lying and being in the County of Shelby to wit: the west half of the South West quarter of section one, township twenty four, Range fifteen east, in the district of Tuscaloosa Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversions and reversionary remainders and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof and also the whole right title interest claim & demand whatsoever of him the said party of the first part, either in law or in equity of in and to the above bargained premises, and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold to the said party of the second part his heirs & assigns forever to the sole and solely proper use and benefit of the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever.
