I now all swear by these presents that we Elizabeth
Wilson & William A. Wilson of Shelby County and
State of Alabama, for and in consideration of the
sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars to us in
hand paid by Samuel Randall of the County &
State aforesaid at and before the sealing and
delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof we
do hereby acknowledge, have bargained, sold granted
and confirmed, and by these presents do grant
barter, sell and confirm unto the said Daniel
Randall, a certain female Negro slave named
Mariah and a certain male Slave named Wesley
And to have and to hold the said two Negro slaves
to them only proper use and behoof of the said
Samuel Randall, his executors, administrato-
res and assigns forever, and we the said Elig-
abeth Wilson and Williams A. Wilson for our

relies, our ex-rulers and administrators the said
Negro slaves to the said Daniel Bassett all his ex-
rulers, administrators and assessors against us
the said Elizabeth Wilson and Mr. A. Wilson
our ex-rulers administrators and assessors and against
all and every other person and persons who also
may shall and will warrant and force defend
by this present, provided always and it is
humbly agreed between the said parties that
these presents shall be if the said Elizabeth
Wilson and William A. Wilson or her executors,
administrators and assessors or any of us do and
shall will and truly pay or cause to be paid
unto the said Daniel Bassett all or his attorney
attorneys administrators ex-rulers and assessors
on or before the first day of January 1830
for the redemption of the humble bargaining
present, their then presents and every claim
and condition herein contained shall cease
and be void, otherwise to remain in full force
and effect. In witness whereof we have here-
set our hands and affixed our seals this 1st
1st day of January 1829.
