consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars

to me in hand paid by Thos Stone of the
State and County aforesaid the receipt whereof
I do hereby acknowledge have so aytid bar-
gained, sold and released and by due pres-
ents do grant, bargayne all or release unto the
said Thomas Stone, his heirs and assigns
forever ex certā tract or parcel of land con-
taining one hundred and sixty & $\frac{3}{4}$ acres more
or less sit being the north east quarter of section
number twenty sixth circuit range line East
on which I now live lying and being in
the County and State aforesaid waters of Yellow
leaf creek together with all and singular
the rights, members, hereditaments and ap-
portionments to the same belonging or in any
wise included thereto. To have and to hold all
and singular the premises above mentioned
unto the said Dugir Thornton Thomas Stone
his heirs & assigns forever and I do hereby
bind myself my heirs, executors or adminis-
trators to warrant and forever defend all &
singular the said bargained premises unto the
said Thomas Stone his heirs or assigns against
myself, my heirs or assigns and against
every person or persons whomsoever lawfully
claiming to claim the same or any part
thereof. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this nineteenth day of
December in the year of our Lord one thousand
said eight hundred and twenty nine.
