

Walker John To Green M <sup>r</sup> Elroy Page 56.	This Indenture made this twenty ninth day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty between John Walker of the first part and Cassin Sumble, & James Waldrop Trustees of the second part, and Green M <sup>r</sup> Elroy of the third part, Whereas the said John Walker is justly indebted to the said Green M <sup>r</sup> Elroy in the sum of fifty Dollars to be paid on the fifteenth day of November next as by a note bearing date on the twenty ninth day of January in the year eighteen hundred and
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thirty more fully appears which said debt  
the said Walker is willing and appears to  
renew, now this Indenture, Witness  
That for and in consideration of the premises  
and also for the further consideration of twenty  
five cents to the said John Walker in hand  
paid by the said Aaron Samble & James  
Wordsworth, at and before the making and deliv-  
ering of these presents, the receipts whereof is  
hereby acknowledged by the said John Walker  
hath given, granted, bargained, sold and confirmed  
and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain  
sell and confirm to the said Aaron Samble  
and James Wordsworth their heirs & assigns for-  
ever, the following property to wit: one small  
more or less old thirty three head of hogs,  
mashed namely four rows and the rest young  
hogs with their swine, three head of sheep  
with their swine on each, of five head of  
goats & their swine to leave and to hold the  
above described property hereby conveyed unto  
the said Aaron Samble and James Wordsworth  
their executors, administrators &c. to their own  
proper use benefit & behoof upon trust never-  
theless, that the said Aaron Samble and James  
Wordsworth, their heirs, executors, administrators  
&c. shall permit the above personal property  
to remain in the quiet & peaceable possession  
of the said John Walker until default be made  
in the payment of the said note for fifty Dollars  
or any part thereof and then upon this further  
trust that then the said Trustees their exe-  
cutors, administrators or assigns shall as soon  
as the happening of said default as they  
may think proper, or at the request of the  
said Green M<sup>r</sup> Elroy sell the above property  
or so much as they may deem sufficient &  
shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder  
for ready money at public auction after  
having fixed the time and place of sale  
at their own direction giving ten days notice  
thereof by public advertisement made at two of  
the most public places in the County and  
at the Court house door of said County and  
out of the moneys arising from such sale  
after satisfying the charges thereof and all

and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Green M<sup>e</sup> Elroy, his exors administrators or assigns the said sum of fifty Dollars with interest and the balance if any shall be paid to the said John Walker his exors, administrators or assigns, but if the whole of the said sum of Fifty Dollars be fully paid off & discharged by the said Green M<sup>e</sup> Elroy his exors, administrators or assigns on or before the fifteenth day of November next when the same is made payable, so that no default of payment be made then this indenture to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue. In witness whereof the said parties to the presents, have hereunto set their hands & seals, the day & date above written.
