debtor of the first part, and W. H. Mr
Henry the trustee of the second part and
Bryant Esq. of the third part and

also the creditor; whereas the said Louis Dulane is partly indebted and has confessed judgment in the County Court of Shelby County for the sum of three thousand ninety three Dollars & 1/100 in favor of the said Bryant Gordon on the 2^d day of May 1832 and the said Louis Dulane the debtor is willing and desirous to secure the said Bryant Gordon in the payment of the said sum of money, now this indenture, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said M. H. McHenry at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Louis Dulane hath given, granted, bargained sold aliened and replepp'd, released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant, bargain and sell to the said M. H. McHenry his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract of land at Kymulga and the ferry at the same place known as the land and ferry at Kymulga, also a stock of hogs, boys and cattle and all the store house of goods in the said Louis Dulane's possession at his store at Kymulga the stock of goods consists of dry goods, groceries, crockery &c. and the stock of cattle are 4 in number, 2 hogs, 20 head of hogs also the books of the said Louis Dulane and all notes, and orders which are due the said Louis Dulane, to the amount of fifteen hundred Dollars and the ferry at the same of one thousand Dollars including the tract of land the title to said property the said Louis Dulane will forever defend to the said M. H. McHenry, now this indenture further Witnesseth that if the said Louis Dulane shall make default in the payment of the same three thousand Dollars ninety three Dollars & 1/100 by the first day of January next, then and in that case ~~case~~ the said M. H. McHenry shall by sale at public Auction proceed to sell on the premises after giving twenty days notice in the newspaper proceed to sell the said property mentioned in this indenture and shall after paying the expenses of such sale pay over and satisfy to the said B. Gordon the said sum of three thousand and ninety three Dollars & 1/100 being the amount of

of the judgment with legal intent, and the balance of the money, if any remains he the said M^r Henry shall pay over the same to the said Julane the said M^r Henry further agrees with the said Julane that the property mentioned in this indenture shall remain in possession of the said Julane and that the said Julane may dispose of the same provided he makes and accounts to the said Bryant Gordon & Co. for so much as he disposes of and the said Bryant Gordon & Co. has authorized the said M^r Henry to suffer the said Julane to transact the business of selling & disposing of the goods and collecting the notes and the said Louis Julane agrees to account to and with the said Bryant Gordon & Co. for the proceeds of all the property mentioned in this indenture until the said amount of three thousand eight hundred and one hundred is fully satisfied and made off. In witness whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands and seals, this 7th day of May in the year of our Lord 1832.
