and in consideration that I am in-
debted to the Branch of the Bank of the
State of Alabama located at Montgomery
under the 21st section of the Act of June
1837 by three promissory notes copies of
which are hereon endorsed and also for
the further consideration of one dollar
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
do hereby bargain and sell unto said
Branch Bank the following tract or
parcel of land lying and being in said
County and designated as follows to wit
The North East Fraction Section no seven
Township no. Twenty one Range no. Two
East and also three negroes to wit: Anica
a negro woman, Mary a negro woman
and Molly a negro woman. To have and
to hold the said land and negroes to said
Branch Bank forever provided that if
said notes are punctually paid these
presents shall be void but if any or
either of said notes are not punctually
paid it shall be lawful for the president
of the said Branch Bank to seize and
sell said NE Fraction Sec. 7 T 21 R 2 E
and said Anica Mary and Molly negro
woman at public auction at such time
and place as he may think proper giv-
ing ten days notice of the same by
advertisement in some paper published
in said state and applying the proceeds
of said sale to the payments of said notes
or either of them whether the same are
due or not with all interest damages

and costs as well of the sale as upon the notes and the said James G. Bullock doth hereby for himself his heirs and assigns covenant and agree to defend the titles made on such sale against all persons
