 State of Alabama of the one part & Miles J. Horton of the
 other part Witnesseth that the said party of the first part
 for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & sixty
 Dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged have this day bargained sold aliened enfeoffed
 and conveyed & by these presents do bargain sell enfeoff
 and convey to the said party of the second part all that
 certain tract or piece of Land lying & being in the county
 & State aforesaid known as follows viz the North West quarter
 of the South West quarter of Section No Thirteen Township
 Twenty Two Range One West to have & to hold the
 above described Land & premises with the tenements and
 Appurtenances unto the said party of the second part his
 heirs & assigns forever & the said party of the first part
 for their heirs Executors & administrators do warrant & will
 forever defend the title to the above described Land
 & premises unto the said party of the second part his heirs
 and assigns from & against us the said party of the first
 part & all & every person or persons claiming or holding
 under the said party of the first part & also against the
 Lawful title claim or demand of all & every person or
 persons whomever claiming or holding by force or under
 the Government of the United States - In testimony whereof
 the said party of the first part have hereunto set their
 hands & seals the day & year above written
