 Negroes } County of Shelby & State of Alabama
 Isaac B. Edwards } and greeting whereas said crop
 of said County & State did on the fifteenth day of April
 A.D. 1845 execute to me as trustee a Deed of Gift to save
 the payment of a certain debt therein mentioned to
 Edmund King of the County & State aforesaid which I,
 Deed is of record in this of the Clerk of the County Court
 of said County in Deed Book & Pages 376, 377, & 378 inclusive
 and whereas the said said crop failed to make payment
 of said Debt on the tenth day of November A.D. 1845
 at said Kings request by virtue of said deed of trust
 (after giving such notice of time of sale as was then in
 required) I proceeded to offer & sell to the highest bidder
 at the Town of Montevallo the following Negro slaves
 to wit Sam about 37 years old for the sum of Five
 hundred and seventy eight dollars; Matilda about 28 years
 old & her two children Charlotte about 3 years old &
 Joe 11 months old for the sum of six hundred and
 twenty five dollars and Nancy about 14 years old
 for the sum of four hundred & eighty two dollars also
 certain tracts or parcels of Land lying and being in the
 County aforesaid more especially Land distinct designated
 in said Deed of trust as the E. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 & the S.W. 1/4 of the
 S.W. 1/4 of Section 31, Township 19, Range 3, West Also the N.W. 1/4 of
 Section six Township 20, Range 3 West Also the N.E. 1/4 of
 Section one and the West half of the S.E. 1/4 of Section one
 also the W. 1/2 of the N.E. 1/4 & the E. 1/2 of the N.W. 1/4 and the
 N.W. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 of Section 12 Township 20 Range 3 West
 (Except 14 1/2 acres in the W. 1/2 S.W. 1/4 Section 31 sold to John
 Wilson & 20 acres in N.E. 1/4 Section one sold to Mrs. Adams
 together with all & singular the appurtenances thereto
 belonging or in anywise appertaining to Isaac B. Edwards
 of the County of Lowndes State aforesaid he being the highest
 bidder for the sum of Two thousand six hundred &
 fifty dollars as follows viz) one thousand
 one hundred & sixteen dollars as a credit to the 28th
 day of February 1846 one thousand one hundred and
 eighty dollars as a credit till 28th February 1847 the
 balance three hundred & seven 77 1/2 Dollars in cash

Now I enjoin that I John S. Store trustee —
 as aforesaid by virtue of the authority vested in me
 by the said Deed of trust and in consideration of the
 said above of four thousand three hundred & twenty
 five dollars secured as required by the terms of sale
 and in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby —
 acknowledged and granted bargained & sold and

and Charly to hand and have said license upon trust
entire default he make in the payment of said debt
to said Nelson then said Blackberry may seize hold &
sell said things to the highest bidder for cash first
paying the time & place of said sale and pay said debt
and the balance to said Lyon but should said debt
to said Nelson be paid then this deed as said to be
