 this day between James Atkinson of
 the first part and Edward Henry of the second part -
 Witnesseth that where as the party of the first part
 have become jointly indebted to the party of the
 second part in the following manner viz) and note
 payable to Edward Henry the party of the second -
 part for the sum of thirty seven dollars & fifty
 cents due the 25th of December 1845 - and other note
 for thirty seven dollars & 50 cents payable as above
 and due 25th December 1846 also one other for
 thirty five dollars and ninety cents payable to the
 party of the first part and due the 25th of
 December 1846 and other for fourteen dollars &
 sixty seven & a half cents due the 25th of Decr
 1847 and payable to the party of the second part
 all of which the said James Atkinson the party
 of the first part is willing and anxious to secure
 to the said Edward Henry the party of the 2^d part in the

following manner to wit I do this day relinquish
 all my title and title interest and claims unto Edward
 Henry the party of the second part the following property
 to wit one bay mare & one cross gray horse one mule
 clock one wash bath seventy heads of hogs fifty
 bushels of corn one head of furniture one fodder
 stack one looking glass upon the terms and conditions
 hereinafter stated that is to say if the before mentioned
 debt is not otherwise paid or satisfied by the first
 day of Sept. next the said Edward Henry the party
 of the 2^d part is authorized and empowered by
 James Atkinson of the first part to seize upon or
 sell the above described property by giving two
 days notice at one or more public places to be
 sold at the instance of the party of the first part
 or some other public place to the highest bidder
 at public sale for cash and the overplus
 of money if any there be after selling the aforesaid
 debts shall be paid over to James Atkinson his
 heirs or assigns when called upon by three
 good men in my hand and seal
