ths of an acre according to the official plat of the survey
of the said Lands returned to the general Land office
by the surveyor General which said tract has been
purchased by the said Ohio State Now know ye that

of the promises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress
in such case made and provided Have Given and Granted
and to his heirs the said tract above described To have and
to hold the same together with all the rights privileges
immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature then and
belonging unto the said Ohio State and to his heirs
and assigns forever In Testimony Whereof J. Martin
Van Buren President of the United States of
America have caused these letters to be made public
and the seal of the general Land office to be hereunto
affixed Given under my hand at the City of
Washington the twentieth day of September in the
year of our Lord and thousand Eight hundred &
thirty nine of the Independence of the United
States the twenty fourth
