 the North East $\frac{1}{4}$ of the North East $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21 in
 Township 19 of Range 3 East containing $40 \frac{6}{10}$ Acres
 And the Land District of Enclosed Alabama and
 together with all and singular the incidents and
 appurtenances therunto belonging in or in any wise
 appertaining unto the said John McClanahan his
 heirs and assigns forever and the said George J
 Hancock do by these presents bind myself my heirs
 & the title to said Land & premises and every part
 thereof to warrant and forever defend to the said
 John McClanahan his heirs and assigns of and
 himself his heirs and assigns the lawful claims
 or claims of any other person in or to whom of the
 said George J Hancock and heirs to set his name
 and affixed his seal the day and date above written
