

Jas. O'Hara & his wife to the State of Alabama Shelly County
 this indenture made this forth day of
 J. S. Storer January in the year of our Lord 1849
 Decd. Gust. between James O'Hara & Cynthia O'Hara
 his wife of the first part & John S. Storer of the second part
 & Edmond King of the third part Whereas the said James
 & Cynthia O'Hara are jointly indebted to the said E. King in
 the sum of Two Thousand and two Hundred and ninety nine $\frac{52}{100}$ dollars
 and third of which amt. with interest from date is to
 be paid the 3^d day of July, 1850 (which will then be for
 the second third to be paid the 5th day of July, 1851 with interest
 from date (which will then amt. to \$899.37) & the last third
 with int. to be paid the 3^d day of July, 1852 (which 3^d will
 be \$905.80) as by note bearing even date with these
 presents more fully appears Now this indenture
 Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises &
 also for the further consideration of one dollar to the
 said James & Cynthia O'Hara in hand paid by the said
 John S. Storer at and before the sealing and delivering
 of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 Given by the said James O'Hara & Cynthia O'Hara have
 bargained sold granted confirmed and by these
 presents do bargain sell grant & confirm to the said John
 S. Storer his Executors Administrators and assigns the
 following negro slaves named to wit: Jenny a woman about
 forty years old Jasper a boy about 18 months old -
 Charles a boy about 15 years old Emily a girl about
 12 years old Clara a girl about 10 years old Fessha
 a girl about 8 years old Josephus a boy about 6 years
 old & Gus a man about 34 years old as well as the
 future increase of the females of the said slaves to
 have and to hold the said negro slaves & the future
 increase of the females of the said slaves to the only proper
 use and behoof of the said John S. Storer his Executors
 Administrators and assigns for ever & as the said James
 & Cynthia O'Hara for themselves and Executors and
 Administrators the said negro slaves & future in case
 the said John S. Storer his Executors Administrators or
 assigns against us and Executors &c

and against all every person or persons whatsoever shall and will Warrant & foreward by these presents upon trust nevertheless that the said John & Storrs his heirs - Executors or administrators shall permit the said James & Cynthia to remain in quiet & peaceable possession of the aforesaid slaves and take the profits thereof to their own use until default be made in the first second or third payment in the note before mentioned either in the whole or in part, and then upon this further trust that he his heirs Executors administrators or assigns shall & will upon the happening of such default of payment sell the said Negro Slaves & increase to the highest bidder for ready money at public Auction at Montevallo at 12 O'clock noon after giving twenty days notice by advertisement at the Court House and at Montevallo and out of the monies arising from such sale shall after paying the charges attending the premises pay to the said E. King his Executors Administrators or assigns the whole amount of Two Thousand two hundred ninety nine ⁵³/₁₀₀ dollars with the interest thereon if there is a default in the first payment if in the second payment the whole amount then due with interest if in the third the balance then due with interest and the balance if any shall pay to the said James & Cynthia O'Hara their heirs or assigns but if the whole of the first payment in said note the second & third payments as they severally fall due shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said E. King his Executors Administrators or assigns on or before the 3^d day of February 1850 - 3^d July 1851 & the 3^d July 1852 so that no default of payment shall be made then this indenture to be valid or else to remain in full force & virtue - In Witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written sealed & subscribed in presence of J.
