 for the said Cynthia O'Hara the sum of Twelve hundred and
 fifty dollars for which sum she with her said husband
 have made their promissory note of this date to be paid
 three years after date with the legal interest there on
 according with debt she is willing & desirous to secure now
 this indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of
 the premises and also for the further consideration of one
 Dollar to the said James & Cynthia O'Hara in hand paid
 by the said John S. Stokes at and before the sealing
 and delivering of ~~these~~ hereof the receipt whereof is truly
 acknowledged they the said James & Cynthia O'Hara have
 and by these presents do grant bargain sell & confirm
 to the said Stokes his Executors Administrators assigns the
 following negro slaves to wit Jenny a woman about forty
 years old Henry a man about 20 years old ~~Joseph~~ a boy about
 18 months old - Charles a boy about 15 years old -
 Emily a girl about 13 years old - Clara a girl about
 10 years old Rosetta a girl about 8 years old Joseph
 a boy about 8 years old & Glen a man about 14 years
 old as well as the future increase of the females of the
 said slaves to have and to hold the said negro slaves
 and the future increase of the females of the said slaves
 to the only proper use & behoof of the said John S. Stokes
 his Executors Administrators and assigns forever & with
 the said James & Cynthia O'Hara for ever theirs, and
 Executors & Administrators the said negro slaves and
 increase to the said Stokes his Executors Administrators and
 assigns us our Executors & assigns against all and every
 persons & persons whatsoever shall and will warrant
 & forever defend by these presents upon trust nevertheless
 that the said John S. Stokes his Executors & Administrators
 shall permit the said James & Cynthia to remain in quiet
 and peaceable possession of the abovesaid slaves & take
 the profits thereof to her own use until default be
 made in the payment of said note either in whole or in -

part, and then upon this further trust that said Store, his heirs Executors administrators or assigns shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment as the said T. S. Druggins his Executors administrators or assigns shall request sell the said negro slaves and increase to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction at Montevallo at 10 o'clock noon after giving sixty days notice by advertisement at the Court House and at Montevallo in said County and out of the proceeds monies arising from such sale shall after paying all expenses attending the premises pay to the said T. S. Druggins his Executors administrators or assigns the whole amount of Twelve hundred & fifty dollars with the interest thereon and the balance if any shall pay to the said Cynthia O'Hara her heirs Executors administrators or assigns but if the whole of said sum of Twelve hundred & fifty dollars shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said T. S. Druggins his Executors administrators or assigns on or before the Eight day of January in the year 1852 when the same is payable so that no default of payment of the said sum of \$1250.00 be made then this intention to be made or else to remain in full force & virtue in Witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written sealed & delivered in the presents of
