of Section 17 Township 22 Range one East in the Precinct or
Land district in the State of Alabama containing one hun
dred & twenty Acres be the same more or less Together
with all and singular the hereditaments and appurten
ances thereto belonging as in any wise belonging as
appertaining and the the reversion and reversions and
remainders or remainders yet to come and profits thereof
and also all the estate right title interest claim or
demand whatsoever of him the said party of the first
either in Law or equity of us and to the above bar
gained premises and every part and parcel
thereof to have and to hold to the said party of
the second part his heirs and assigns to the
sole and and only proper use and benefit of
him the said party of the second part his heirs
and assigns forever the right and title therunto

with the said party of the first will warrant and power
 defend against the Claim or Claims of All and every
 person or persons what soever in Testimony whereof we have
 hereunto set our hands and seals this 17 day of January 1849
