 acknowledge have given granted bargained and sold
 and by these presents do give grant bargain sell
 convey and confirm unto the said Elizabeth Watson
 her heirs and assigns forever a certain tract of land
 known as follows to wit the south west fourth of
 the south west fourth of section No fifteen also the
 south east fourth of the south east fourth also the
 south east fourth of the south east fourth of section
 sixteen all in Township twenty two of range two west
 containing 119 2/3 acres in the Tuscaloosa Land District
 To have and to hold the above described tract of
 Land with the tenements and appurtenances thereto
 belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said
 Elizabeth Watson her heirs and assigns forever and the
 said party of the first part for their heirs Executors and
 administrators do warrant and forever defend the title
 to the above described and hereby granted premises

unto the said Elizabeth Watson his hire and agrees
from and against us the said Abraham & Mary
Norris and all and every person or persons whomsoever
claiming in any manner whatsoever In testimony where
of the said party of the first part have hereunto set
their hands & seals the 21 day of August A.D. 1848

right of dower in & to the land and appurtenances embraced
in the within deed to said Elizabeth Watson
