

This Indenture made & entered into this
 the 18th day of February Anno Domini 1830 between
 John Lolley and his wife Jane Lolley of the
 first part & Geo D Shortridge of the second part
 all of the County of Shilley Witneseth
 That whereas the parties of the first part for & in
 Consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars
 to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged have bargained sold and
 conveyed Granted & enfeoffed to the party of the
 second part his heirs and assigns all right title
 claim & interest which they now have of in & to
 the following described tracts & parcels of Land
 Situate in the County of Shilley & in the District
 of Lands subject to entry at Tuscaloosa to wit
 the north west half of the north east quarter of
 Section 19 Township 22 & Range Three west Con-
 taining Eighty acres more or less & the south
 East half of the south west quarter of Section
 18 Township 22 & Range Three west Containing eigh-
 ty acres more or less to have & to hold to him
 his heirs forever And we do Covenant with the
 said Shortridge that we have a good right & title
 to sell & dispose of said Lands that they are
 free from all incumbrances & that we will
 warrant & defend the same forever against the
 lawful claims of any & all persons
