

The State of Alabama: This indenture made between Tye
 Shelby County 3 Davis of the one part & Lewis Kelly
 of the other part both of the County
 & State aforesaid mentioned wherein Lewis Kelly doth
 hold a note on Tye Davis for the sum of thirty three
 dollars & Twenty Cts the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-
 ledged hath granted bargained and sell unto the
 said Lewis Kelly his Executors administrators and
 assigns a certain brown bay horse now in possession
 of William Davis to have and to hold the said horse
 to the said Lewis Kelly his Executors administrators
 and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of
 said party of the second part his Executors administrators
 & assigns for ever Conditioned that if the said Tye
 Davis his Executors administrators shall & do well
 and truly pay or cause to be paid into the said
 Lewis Kelly his Executors administrators or assigns the
 full amount of the above described note by the
 first of August next then this obligation to be void
 & the said Tye Davis his Executors administrators
 & assigns against Tye Davis & against all other
 persons whatsoever shall warrant & for ever defend
 by their presents & Lewis Kelly for himself his
 his Executors Administrators doth covenant promise

grant and gave to and with the said Tynd Davis
his executors administrators that he and she shall
and will deliver immediately upon the receipt of
the sum of the note a bond mentioned at the day
and time a bond limited for payment through of
Lewis Kelly his executors administrators and assigns
the said bond a bond described which and now
and at the time of execution of these presents were
received of the said Lewis Kelly of the said Tynd
Davis in witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my seal this the
23rd of April 1850 Tynd G. Davis *(Signature)*
