to } This Indenture, made this fifth
J. S. Storrs. } day of September, 1850, between
Edmund King, the creditor, John S. Storrs,
the trustee, and John J. Weekes and John
W. Naish, the debtors, — this Indenture witness-
eth, that the said John J. Weekes and John
W. Naish is justly indebted to the said King
the sum of six hundred and sixty-four

dollars, on a note of hand bearing even date with this indenture, and due the first day of January, 1852. Which debt the said Weeks and Naish being willing and desirous to secure, hath this day and date above mentioned, granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, and sell, and convey unto the said John S. Storrs, the following described tracts of land, lying in the county aforesaid, and Tuscaloosa land district, designated as follows: The $E\frac{1}{2}$ S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section twenty-seven Township 20 of Range three West, being the place where James Weeks at present resides: also another Tract of land where the above mentioned John J. Weeks at present resides, described as follows: beginning at the N.E. corner of the N.E. quarter of Section eight Township 21 of R. three W. Thence West 180 poles, thence South 160 poles, thence 40 poles, thence South 50 poles to a certain made corner, thence East 160 poles, thence North 50 poles, thence East 140 poles, thence North 160 poles, thence West 140 poles to the beginning—supposed to be 170 acres. Also, another tract of land described as the W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Section nine T. 21 of Range 3 West, with the exception of one half acre on which the Methodist Church called Bethel now stands; also with the exception of about seven acres off of the N.E. corner sold to David Meridith; also the East half of the East half of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 8 T. 21 of Range three West, containing 113 acres; together with all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining—to have and to hold unto the said John S. Storrs, his heirs and assigns forever, and we the said John J. Weeks and John W. Naish, for ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators against all persons will warrant and forever defend in fee simple—nevertheless, in trust: and it is hereby agreed between the said Weeks and Naish and the said John S. Storrs, that if the said sum of money is not paid to the said Edmund King, on

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on or before the time it is due as specified in said note as above mentioned, that the said John S. Storrs shall ~~be~~ so soon thereafter as the said King may direct, or the said John S. Storrs think proper, sell the said tract of land at public auction at Montevallo, after having given thirty days' public notice by advertisement at three public places in said county, and from the proceeds of sale to satisfy and pay over to the said Edm'd King said sum of money and all necessary expenses; and any surplus that may remain to pay over to the said Weekes and Naish, their heirs and assigns, and it is further understood and agreed that the said John S. Storrs is to permit the said Weekes & Naish to remain in the possession and to enjoy the profits and advantages of the said several tracts of land until default be made in payment of the said sum of money.
