quarter of Section Sixteen in Township Twenty one
 of Range two West Containing forty acres more
 or less in the District of Land Subject to Sale at
 Tuscaloosa Alabama together with all and sing-
 =ular the appurtenances hereditaments and rights in
 any way appertaining unto the said John Nabors
 his heirs and assigns forever and the said James Ogley for himself
 his heirs Executors and administrators doth warrant &
 will ever defend the right and title to the above described
 and hereby conveyed premises unto the said John Nabors
 his heirs and assigns from and against the Claim of him
 the said James Ogley and all and Every person or persons cl-
 =aiming or holding under or by the said James Ogley and
 also against the lawful title Claim or demand of all
 and Every person or persons whosoever Claiming or
 holding by or from under the General government
