 eight thousand dollars to us in hand paid by said
 Christopher Salsar the receipt of which we do hereby
 acknowledge we have given granted bargained
 sold and delivered and by these Presents do give
 grant bargain sell and deliver to said Christopher
 Salsar and his heirs forever the following
 negroes slaves and other personal property to wit
 Lydia a negro woman of dark complexion about
 fifty or fifty two years of age Mary a negro woman
 of dark complexion about thirty five years
 of age Boylon a negro man of light complexion
 about twenty three years of age Charles a negro
 man of dark complexion about twenty two years
 of age Mariah a negro girl of dark complexion
 about eighteen years of age Rebecca a negro girl
 of dark complexion about fourteen years of age
 Beulien a negro boy of dark complexion about
 fourteen years of age Jason a negro boy of dark
 complexion about ten years of age Jacob a negro boy
 of yellow complexion about nine or ten years of age
 Shadrack a negro boy of dark complexion about
 nine or ten years of age Witta a negro girl of dark
 complexion William a negro boy of dark complexion
 about eleven or twelve years of age also some house
 hold and kitchen furniture our stock of horses oxen
 cattle hogs sheep one waygon and such tools and gear

all the same now in hand and in our possession at this time, to have and hold the same to said Christopher Salsce and his heirs forever and me the said George and Susannah Salsce do covenant to and with said Christopher Salsce that we are legally seized of the negroes and other property aforesaid and that we have good right to sell and convey the same manner and form aforesaid and that ^{we} will forever ~~and~~ warrant and defend letters to the same to said Christopher Salsce and his heirs forever in testimony of which witness my hand seal this 18th day of October 1850
