

This indenture made this first day of February 1837
 between Strong and Ulrick of the County of Mobile Alabama
 of the one part and Frederick Stewart of said County of
 the other part Witnesseth That the said Strong and Ulrick
 in consideration of Twelve hundred dollars to them in hand
 paid by the said Frederick Stewart the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged have granted bargained sold released and Confirmed
 and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and
 Confirm unto the said Frederick Stewart his heirs and assigns
 forever the following described tracts or parcels of land lying
 situate and being in Shelby County Alabama viz the west half
 of the South west quarter of section twenty and Township eighteen
 of range one west and that portion of the east half of the
 said section township and range lying south of Moss Gilberts
 and south of dry Creek and also a certain portion of the north
 west quarter of section twenty eight lying north of the Spring
 branch containing together one hundred and eighty five
 acres more or less Together with all and singular the
 hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same
 belonging or appertaining and the survivors remainders

rights issues and profits thereof and also all the estate right
 title interest trust property claim and demand what soever
 both at law and in equity of the said Strang & Ulrick into
 or out of the said lands tenements hereditaments & premises
 To have and to hold the said lands tenements and heredit-
 -aments and all and singular other the premises herein
 before mentioned with their appurtenances unto the said
 Frederick Stewart his heirs and assigns and to his and their
 only proper use and behoof and the said Strang and
 Ulrick do hereby for themselves their heirs executors and
 administrators Covenant promise and agree to and with
 the said Frederick Stewart his heirs executors administrators
 and assigns in manner following viz That the said Frederick Stewart
 his heirs and assigns shall and may peaceably and quietly
 have hold and enjoy the said lands and premises and every
 part thereof without the least trouble eviction or disturbance
 of the said Strang and Ulrick their heirs and assigns or of
 or by any other person or persons lawfully claiming as
 to claim from by or under or in trust for them or any
 of them And that the said lands tenements hereditaments
 and premises and every part thereof now and and from
 - henceforth shall continue to be unto the said Frederick
 Stewart his heirs and assigns free and clear and free
 and clear acquitted & honorated and discharged of from
 and against all former and other gifts grants bargains
 sales mortgages estates titles charges and incumbrances what
 soever have made done or suffered by the Strang and
 Ulrick or by any other person lawfully claiming as
 to claim by force or under them or by their act or
 agent or government and that the said Strang and
 Ulrick are well seized of the premises and have
 good right to bargain and sell the same in manner
 and form above written and the said Strang and
 Ulrick and their heirs all and singular the afore-
 said lands tenements hereditaments and prem-
 -ises and every part thereof unto the said Frederick
 Stewart his heirs and assigns against the said Strang and
 Ulrick their heirs and assigns shall and
 will warrant and forever defend by their heirs
 -ents In witness whereof we have hereunto set our
 hands and seals this first day of February one
 thousand eight hundred and fifty
