

The State of Alabama: To all whom it may concern
 Shelby County: Whereas by a certain writ of Execu-
 -tion Comely called a fieri facias Issued from the clerk office
 of circuit court for said county directed to any sheriff of the state
 of Alabama dated 21st day of March A.D. 1850 and 23rd day of said
 month delivered to one J. James M. Hinely Sheriff of said County
 Commanded that of the Goods and Chattels Lands & Tenements
 of Thomas L. Pledger I cause to be made the sum of one hundred &
 sixty seven dollars with Thos. & Brasher & Samuel Brasher
Merchants & Partners using firm name of Thos. & Brasher Thos.
 lately on eleventh day of March A.D. 1850 the Circuit Court of Shelby
 County had recovered against him for their damages which they had
 sustained by non performance of certain promises an assumption
 by the said defendant to the said plaintiff then lately made
 as also the sum eight 38/100 of dollars as for cost in and about their
 suit in behalf expended whereof the said defendant convicted
 as appears to us of record and that I have said money at our
 next circuit court for said County on the fourth Monday in
 August next there after, to render to said plaintiff for damages
 and cost as aforesaid as by reference to said writ of execution
 will fully & at large appear & whereas after the coming of said writ
 of execution to my of aforesaid and before the return day thereof to wit
 on the first day of July A.D. 1850 ^{to holder} J^{as}. M. Hinely Sheriff aforesaid did
 by virtue thereof levy the said writ of execution on the fol-
 lowing designated and described tracts & parcels of Lands situated
 in said County & on which the said Thos. L. Pledger then
 resided to wit West half of the South ^{West} Quarter of section Twenty
 one Township Eighteen of range one West of said that portion of
 East half of same section Township & range lying south of
 Mrs. Pilberts & South of dry creek to the West half of the South
 East Quarter also lying south of dry and also a certain portion
 of the North West Quarter of section Twenty Eight lying north of
 the Spring Branch containing together one hundred & eighty
 five acres more or less as the property of said defendant
Thos. L. Pledger and whereas also after having advertised the said
 tracts and parcels of land for sale accordingly at the time
 of the Levy thereon given notice thereof to the said defendant
 in person I J^{as}. M. Hinely as Sheriff aforesaid did by virtue
 of the said writ of execution offer the said lot & parcels of land

for sale to the highest bidder for cash within the usual -
 hours (held at the usual place of Sheriff sale in the
 Town of Montevallo) of sale at Montevallo in said County on
 the second Monday in August A.D. 1830 being the 12th day
 of said month when and at which said sale Alphonsa
 A. Stirratt became & was the last highest & best bidder at
 the sum of one hundred and sixty ^{one} Dollars for the same
 Now therefore Know ye that his Consideration of the prem-
 -ises & of said sum of one hundred and sixty and
 dollars to one in hand paid by said Alphonsa A.
 Stirratt the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 I James M. Finley as Sheriff as aforesaid by virtue
 of the authority aforesaid have bargained and sold
 and by these presents do bargain sell and convey
 unto the said Alphonsa A. Stirratt the said tract
 & parcels of Land with all and singular the prem-
 -ises with its appurtenances being all the right title
 -interest Claim & demand which the said Thomas
 & Pledger Defendant in said writ of execution had
 of me to the same on the said eleventh day of March
 A.D. 1830 as at any time since had or now has To have
 and to hold the same to the said Alphonsa A. Stirratt
 his heirs and assigns forever as fully and as fully
 as absolutely as I the said James M. Finley as Sher-
 -iff as aforesaid by virtue of the authority aforesaid
 can or ought to convey and in Witness of all of
 which I James M. Finley as Sheriff as aforesaid
 hereunto set my hand and seal this the 13th
 day of August A.D. 1830
