 -tion No 11 in Township No 23 of Range No 14 East also
 the S W 1/4 of the N E 1/4 Section No 11 in Township No 23
 of Range No 14 East to have and to hold the aforesaid
 premises with all and singular the appurtenances
 therunto belonging unto the said John Collins
 his heirs and assigns to their use and behoof
 forever and we do covenant with the said John
 Collins his heirs and assigns to their use and be-
 -hoof forever that we are lawfully seized in fee of
 the aforesaid premises that they are free from
 all incumbrances that we have a good right to sell
 and Convey the same to the said John Collins and
 that we will warrant and defend the said pre-
 -mises against the lawful claims and demands
 of all persons in writing whereof we have been
 -to set our hands and seals this the 7th day of
 February 1837
