the party of the 1st part for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and seventy two dollars to them in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell to said McLeod the following land lying in said County to wit. NE fraction of Section 26 T21 R1E the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 26 T21 R1E & the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 23 T21 R1E to have and hold the same for ever & we the 1st party Covenant to & with the 2nd party that we are lawfully seized of the premises aforesaid that we have good right to bargain and sell the same in manner and form aforesaid & hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant & defend titles to said land to said McLeod & his heirs forever with my hands and seals
