

The State of Alabama: This indenture made this Twenty
 Shelby County 3 first day of April Eighteen
 hundred fifty one between Wesley W. Arnett of the
 first part H. Butler of the second part and Geo. M. Baker
 of the third part all of the County and State above
 named witnesseth That whereas the said Wesley W.
 Arnett is indebted to the said Geo. M. Baker in the
 sum of one hundred Twenty nine & 6/100 Dollars the
 same being three promissory notes made payable
 to the order of H. Butler & Co are only to forty and 3/4 of 100
 dollars dated the 19th July Eighteen hundred fifty and
 due one day after date with interest from the first
 Jan'y 1850 and are amounting to forty four 3/100 dollars
 dated 19th July Eighteen hundred fifty and due one day after
 date with interest from first Jan'y Eighteen hun-
 dred fifty also are amounting to forty four 3/100 doll-
 ars dated 19th July Eighteen hundred forty and due
 one day after date & the said Wesley W. Arnett has
 bargained sold aliened and conveyed and by these
 presents doth bargain sell alien and convey unto
 the said H. Butler for and in consideration of the
 sum of five dollars of lawful money to the said
 Wesley W. Arnett by the said H. Butler in hand paid
 at and before the making and delivery of these pres-
 ents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the
 following described Crops now growing To wit so much
 of my Crop of Wheat now growing as will make in good
 and lawful measure sixty Bushels also so much of my
 Crop of Corn now planted and growing as will make in
 good and lawful measure Two hundred bushels
 both of which Crops are to be gathered and packed by
 the said Wesley W. Arnett & Wesley W. Arnett do for
 myself my heirs and assigns warrant and will
 warrant unto the said H. Butler a good and
 lawful right to the Crops now planted and growing
 herein described against all and every person what-
 soever in law or otherwise should the said Wesley
 W. Arnett pay or cause to be paid to the said Geo.
 M. Baker the notes herein described on or before
 the 1st October next then this obligation be void
 and of no effect but should the said Wesley W. Ar-
 nett fail to pay the sum on or before the first
 day of October next in that case the said H. Butler
 may proceed to sell the Crops herein described
 at the house where the said Wesley W. Arnett now
 lives first giving fifteen days notice and then
 the said H. Butler shall apply the proceeds to

the payment of the notes herein described and if there should remain a balance in the hands of the said H Butler arising from the sale of the within described crop after paying the notes herein described notes then the said H Butler shall pay the balance over to the said Wmly W Armitage after paying the expenses of conveying this trust into effect Given under my hand and seal this 21st day of April Eighteen hundred fifty and
