 County to wit the $\frac{1}{2}$ of the $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section seven
 township twenty two of Range three west
 the $\frac{1}{2}$ of the $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section township and
 Range except twenty acres off of the south end
 of said last $\frac{1}{4}$ and also a certain part of
 the $\frac{1}{2}$ of the $\frac{1}{4}$ of section sixteen township
 twenty two of Range three west lying all that
 part of said $\frac{1}{2}$ last named that lies North
 of a high ridge which runs nearly East and West
 through the same the dividing line being on
 the top of said ridge containing thirty eight
 and one half acres more or less all in the
 Tuscaloosa land District Together with all and
 singular the tenements and appurtenances
 thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining
 and also all the estate right title interest
 Claim or demand whatever of the said Emory
 Peck & his said wife the said party of the first
 part either in law or equity of in and to
 the above bargained premises and every part
 and parcel thereof to have and to hold to
 the said party of the second part & his heirs
 and assigns to the whole and only proper
 use ~~benefit~~ and behoof of the said party of
 the second part & his heirs and assigns forever
 And the said party of the first part for their
 heirs executors and administrators do hereby
 warrant and will forever defend the title of
 the above bargained premises to the said party

 Claim of the General Government
