

This Indenture made this 22^d day of May 1837 between
 John McGehee of the first part and Daniel E
 Matrons and Thomas Harrison of the second part
 Whereas the said John McGehee is indebted to
 Edmund King in the sum of four hundred and
 fifty dollars due by note of hand made and
 dated about the first of January 1837 and due
 about the first of January 1838 to which note
 the said Daniel E Matrons and Thomas Harrison
 are securities and whom against all lawful
 reason of said Securityship the said John McGe-
 hee is willing and desirous to secure in secu-
 rity. Now this Indenture witnesseth that in con-
 sideration of the premises and for the Consideration
 of one dollar to him in hand paid the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged The said John
 McGehee hath given granted bargained sold
 enfeoffed released and confirmed and by their
 presents doth give grant bargain sell enfeoff
 and confirm to the said Daniel E Matrons and
 Thomas Harrison their heirs and assigns forever
 all that tract or parcel of Land lying and being
 in Shelby County Alabama and described as the
 E¹/₂ of S E¹/₄ of Section 17 Township 22 Range 3 west
 also the E¹/₂ of S E¹/₄ of said Section Township and
 Range except twenty acres of south end also a
 portion of the NW¹/₄ of S W¹/₄ of Section 16 Township 22
 Range 3 west lying that part of said 1/2 1/4 Section as
 lies north of the ridge running east and west
 through said land all in Tuscaloosa land district
 being the lands purchased by said McGehee of
 E W Pick to whose deed reference is hereby had it
 being the plan on which the said John McGehee
 now lives with all and singular the appurtenances
 to said lands belonging or appertaining and all the
 estate right title and interest of said John McGehee
 to said Granted lands & premises to have and

to hold said lands and premises and appertinances unto the said Daniel E Matrons and Thomas Harrison their heirs executors administrators and assigns forever and the said John Mc Gibony for himself his heirs & doth hereby Covenant with the said Matrons and Harrison their heirs &c that the said John Mc Gibony the said lands and premises with the appertinances unto the said Matrons and Harrison will against all persons warrant and forever defend by their presents Upon trust nevertheless that the said John Mc Gibony shall remain in possession of said land and premises till default be made in payment of said debt to Edmund King in whole or in part and in case of such default then the said Daniel E Matrons and Thomas Harrison or the survivor shall and may sell said lands and premises or so much thereof as shall be necessary at public auction for ready money and repay or reimburse themselves so much as they may have to pay by reason of such suretyship first giving thirty day notice of the time and place of sale and the residue of the moneys arising from said sale after paying expenses and what they may have had to pay on said note to said King shall pay to said John Mc Gibony But if this said John Mc Gibony shall pay off and fully discharge said debt so due to Edmund King so that no default be made in payment and the said Matrons and Harrison be protected against all loss or injury by means of their said suretyship then this indenture to be void else in full force and virtue In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this 22^d day of May 1837
