This Indenture made this the third day of December one thousand Eight hundred and thirty six between Benjamin Candrie of the County of Shelby and State of Alabama of the one part and Kenneth L Morrison of the State and County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of Eight hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Kenneth L Morrison the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and deliver unto the said Kenneth L Morrison a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County and State aforesaid viz the East half of North West quarter of Section 10 Elmore Town-
=Ship Twenty Range two East also the North West 1/4 North East 1/4 of Section ten Township twenty Range two East and the North East fourth South East fourth of Section Ten Township Twenty Range two East together with the South East fourth North East fourth Section Ten Township twenty Range two East in the Tuscaloosa Dist to have and to hold the above mentioned land and premises unto the above said Kenneth L Morrison his heirs and assigns for ever I do hereby warrant and forever defend the right and title to the said mentioned land and premises with all the appurtenances therunto belonging or any wise appertaining unto the said Kenneth L Morrison his heirs and assigns forever from me and my heirs and from the lawful claim of all manner of persons whatsoever claiming by Writings whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day and date above written signed sealed and delivered { Benjamin Candrie
