This Indenture made this the twentieth day of August
A D 1881 between Abraham Naich of the first part John
A. Stone of the second part and Edmund King of the third
part Whereas the said Abraham Naich is greatly indebted

to the said Edmund King in the sum of two hundred twenty seven dollars due the 15th of December next as by his promissory note of this date more fully appears; which debt the said Craish is desirous to secure Now this instrument witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the promises and also for the further Consideration of one dollar to the said E King in hand paid by the said Storrs before the sealing & delivery hereof the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Abraham Craish both and by these presents doth give Grant sell and Convey to the said John Storrs his heirs and assigns forever a negro boy named Tyler about nine years old a slave to have and to hold the said negro slave to the only proper use and behoof of the said John Storrs his heirs executors administrators & assigns forever hereby warranting and defending the same against all persons whatsover Upon trust nevertheless that the said John Storrs his heirs executors administrators shall pay to the said Craish to retain in quiet possession of said slave until default be made in the payment of said note either in whole or in part & this upon this further trust that the said Storrs his heirs &c shall & will so soon after the happening of such default, as he his heirs &c may think proper the said E King his executors administrators or assigns shall request sell ~~the~~ said slave to the highest bidder for Cash at public Auction at Monteville after giving thirty days notice thereof by advertisement at said place And out of the moneys arising from said sale after satisfying the Charges thereof pay the said King his Executors &c the said sum of Two hundred twenty seven dollars & the interest thereon if any and the balance if any shall pay to the said Craish his heirs &c But if the whole of said note shall be paid to the said E King his Executors &c or before the same shall be due without default then this instrument to be void or else to remain in full force & virtue In witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands & seals the day and year first above written
