The State of Alabama } Know all men by these presents  
 Shelby County } that I Henry Gasaway of <sup>the</sup> County  
 of Shelby & state of Alabama have this day bargained  
 and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell  
 unto Henry Webster of the state and County aforesaid, a  
 certain tract or parcel of land lying and being as follows  
 viz - the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 19 Township 18 in  
 Range 2 East also the S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 20 Town-  
 ship 18 range 2 East in the district of Tuscaloosa and state  
 of Alabama to have and to hold the same together with all  
 the appertinencies thereunto belonging to the only proper use  
 and behoof of the said Henry Webster his heirs and assigns  
 forever. And I the said Henry Gasaway do bind myself, my  
 heirs, Executors, administrators, and assigns to warrant and  
 defend the rights and title of the above named land unto the  
 said Henry Webster &c

The condition of the above said  
 is such that, I the said Henry Gasaway shall will and  
 truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Henry Webster his  
 heirs or assigns the sum of thirty one & 86/100 dollars by the  
 first day of January eighteen hundred and fifty three the last  
 named amount with interest from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January last.  
 Then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full  
 force and virtue. Given under my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup>
