 Shelby County } That we David Merideth and
 Elizabeth his wife in and for the consideration of one
 hundred dollars to us in hand paid the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, do bargain, sell, and convey to Wm
Ly Merideth his heirs, and assigns the following tract
 or parcel of land - viz being a portion of the South East fourth
 of Sec. 33 Township Twenty Range 3 W, beginning where
 the fourth line of said Town, crosses Ben Scrimmer's Spring
 branch thence west with said line to Beaver dam creek,
 thence down said creek with its meanders to the mouth
 of the aforesaid Scrimmer's Spring branch, thence along
 said branch with its meanders to the beginning point,
 containing twenty five acres more or less, to have and
 hold said land to the said Wm Ly Merideth, his
 heirs, assigns, and Executors forever, and the party
 of the first part do covenant with the said Wm Ly Merideth
 his heirs, and assigns that they are lawfully signed of
 the premises above granted, that they have a good
 right to sell the same and the title to the same, they
 will and do warrant and defend forever, against the
 lawful claims and demands of all persons whatsoever
 both parties of the State & County afore said,
