Know
all men by these presents that S. William Candlish
of the state and county above mentioned hath this day bargained
and sold unto Mariah Wise of the same state and county my present
crop of cotton with the exception of what is now picked out also
two beds and furniture and a certain red and white heifer marked
with a crop and under bit in the right and swallow fork
in the left ear one large looking glass and one earling steer in the
above marks the said Wise is to have and to hold said described
property as his own right and property for and in consider-
ation of the sum of two hundred dollars to me in hand paid
by the said Wise the receipt thereof is hereby acknowledged
the and state above written. Now it is distinctly understood
before the signing of these presents that if I the said Candlish
shall pay or cause to be paid unto the said Wise all the
demands due against me by note or or before the first day of
January next now in the hands of said Wise and due on the
first day of January next then the above to be null and
void otherwise the above described property is forfeited
by the said Candlish in case of failure on his part—
And I the said Candlish is to take care of and gather
the above described property in good time and good order
and deliver up the same to the said Wise on or before the
first day of January next signed sealed and delivered the
day and date above written in the presents of us. W^m H.
