forty three & 1/100 acres more or less together with all that app-
earances belongs thereunto with the Estate Right Title Interest
claim and Demand of him the said James M. Pringle of in and
to the said tract or parcel of land and premises and every part and
parcel thereof to have and to hold, and the said James M. Pringle
his heirs Executors and assigns shall defend the same Right unto
the said Isabella J and Martha D. Pringle their heirs Executors
and assigns for ever against the demands of any person or persons whom-
