

Know all men by these presents that we Lewis Bowdon and Drusilla Bowdon his wife of Shelby County Alabama for and in consideration of two hundred dollars to us in hand paid by John B Wilson of said County the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained sold and conveyed unto the said John B Wilson and by these presents do bargain sell and convey unto the said John B Wilson his heirs and assigns forever a certain lot or parcel of land lying situate and being in said Shelby County viz; an undivided moiety or half of lot No 4 in said town containing two acres of land more or less; to have and to hold the said undivided half part of said lot or parcel of land unto the said John B Wilson his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Lewis Bowdon and Drusilla his wife do hereby covenant and agree with the said John B Wilson his heirs and assigns that they have good right to bargain and sell the said lot and premises in manner and form above written and that the same is free from all encumbrance whatever and that the said John B Wilson may and shall enjoy the same without the hindrance or disturbance of them or either of them or of any one claiming by through from or under these or either of them, and also that they will forever warrant and defend by these presents the title to said lot or parcel of land as a good and indefeasible estate in fee simple to the said John B Wilson his heirs and assigns forever; In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this 16th day of February 1852.
