Hubby Co county Into this the 10th day of April
1852 Melman Pearson & Musick ^{Debtors} of the first part
and Abraham Blevins the creditor of the 2^d part of
said Co county Witnesseth that whereas said Musick
is partly indebted to said Blevins in the sum of forty
Eight Dollars by note dated the 10 April 1852; and due
1st January 1853. Which said debt said Musick is an
open and obvious to secure therefore for and in con
sideration of the premises as well the sum of one dollar to
him said Blevins in hand paid by said Blevins the receipt
whereof whereby acknowledged said Musick has given grant
bargained and sold and by these presents does give grant barg
ain and sell to said Blevins and to his heirs and assigns
forever the following property to wit five ears 1 calf & three
increase ten head of hogs and the crop of corn and cotton
to be raised by said Musick the present year to have and
hold the same forever on trust said Blevins to permit said
Musick to hold the said property until default be made
in the payment of said debt the said Blevins his representa
tives or assigns may sell said property and sell the same
to the highest bidder for cash or a sufficiency thereof and out
of the proceeds of said sale pay and satisfy said debt 1st
bearing given Twenty days notice of the time and place
of said sale but should the same be fully paid by said
Musick this deed is void Witness my hand seal
