

The State of Alabama: This Indenture this 17th day of April
 Shelby County 3 Ceyntun Hundred and Fifty Two
 between Felix Seal of the first part Charles F. Harvey of the
 second part and the Cutler of the third part all of the state of
 county above named W. Trupitt that whereas the said
 Seal is indebted to the said the Cutler the sum of
 forty three 50/100 Dollars the same being in two promissory
 notes as follows one note for forty five 50/100 Dollars
 dated Dec 22 1851 due one day after date with a credit of this
 sum of 55/100 Dollars Dec 22 1851 and one note forty five 50/100
 Dollars dated Jan 7 1852 due one day after date with interest
 1st Jan 1852 with a credit of twenty five Dollars pay 31st 1852
 which notes at this date amount to the the above named sum
 V. Felix Seal have bargained sold aliened and conveyed
 and by these presents doth bargain sell alien and convey
 unto the said Jas. F. Harvey for and in consideration
 of the sum of Two Dollars of lawful money by the cho.

I. Rowley to the said Felix Seal, in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the following described crops now planted and growing to wit so much of my crop of Cotton planted and growing as will make three thousand pounds in the seed, also so much of my crop of Corn now planted and growing as will make in good and careful measure one hundred bushels both of which crops are to be gathered and put up by the said Felix Seal I Felix Seal do for myself my heirs and assigns warrant and will ever defend unto the said Charles S Rowley, a good and lawful receipt to the crops herein described against all and every person. Intestment in trust nevertheless should the said Felix Seal pay or cause to be paid to the said H Butler the notes herein described. On or before the 1 day of November next then this obligation to be void and of no effect. But should the said Felix Seal fail to pay the same on or before the 1st day of November next, in that case the said Charles S Rowley may proceed to sell the crops herein described at the house where the said Felix Seal now lives 1st giving fifteen days notice and then the said Charles S Rowley shall apply the proceeds to the payment of the notes herein described and if there should remain a balance in his hands of the said C S Rowley arising from the sale of the within described crops after paying the within described notes then the said C S Rowley shall pay the balance over to the said Felix Seal after paying the expenses of carrying this trust into effect given under my hand and seal this 17. day of April 1852
