 the party of the first part, for and in consideration of
 the sum of one dollar to him ^{had} paid by the said
 D. N. McClanahan, also for the consideration hereafter
 expressed and contained hath assigned and Transferred
 Bargained and sold and shall thereby assign Transferred
 Bargained and sell unto the said party of the second
 part all rights, titles and interest or claims of the said
 party of the first part of in and to the following descri-
 -bed property (viz) one Bay mare about 14 years old
 which said property is described as aforesaid by the
 said party of the first part unto the party of the second
 part, interest and for the purpose of securing the
 payment of Eighty Two \$100 Dollars in one judgment for
 Liberty seven \$100 Dollars and one note for Fifty four
 \$6/00 Dollars due one day after date and dated the 3rd of May 1852
 which said notes and interest bearing interest from the first
 of January 1852 and Daniel Miller is anxious and
 Desirous to secure and it is hereby Expressly agreed
 that the aforesaid property is to remain in the
 pacifiable possession of said Daniel Miller until
 the first day of January next and until the said
 party of the second part shall or may require a
 sale may proceed to sell to the highest bidder for
 cash after having given ten days notice by advertise-
 -ment in at least three public places and out of
 the proceeds of said sale pay himself the said
 notes herein and hereby secured and the balance
 if any pay over to said Daniel Miller; but should
 said note be paid by the first day of January next
 or before a sale is required, then this Deed of Trust to
 be void Else to remain in full force and effect
